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3. Course General Objectives:

The course aims to clarify the provisions related to capacity, by defining it and explaining its various sections, and clarifying the symptoms that affect capacity, such as nullifying it, decreasing it or changing some of its provisions. The course also deals, in its first section, with a detailed statement of the provisions of the will, and the second section deals with a statement of the provisions of inheritance and inheritance, by defining the meaning of the inheritance, stating the pillars of inheritance, its conditions and causes, their impediments and the rights related to the inheritance, as well as the number of heirs of men and women, and also deals with talking about Inheritance by imposition and inheritance by blindfolding, detailing the owners of hypotheses, bands and veils, and sheds light in detail on how to solve issues and clarify their types, and explains how to solve issues of pregnancy, missing, and hermaphrodites, copying and exit, obligatory will and liquidation of the estate.

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
