ILO5	The diplomatic mission, consisting of its head and the rest of its members, assumes a number of functions and tasks related to the exercise of its competencies.  • Article 3 of the 1961 Vienna Convention defines the tasks and functions of diplomatic missions and envoys to represent the sending country in the receiving state, protect the interests of its nationals, develop friendly relations between its state and the receiving state, negotiate with the authorities of the host state, and review the development of conditions in the host state. These are diplomatic functions and there are consular functions performed by the diplomatic mission in accordance with the second paragraph of Article Three.
